SUMMARY OF BETHLEHEM COUNCIL MINUTES –

Present at the meeting were Scott Fisher, Pastor Megan Fryling, Brian Grefsrud, Beverly Compton, Sue Akin and Betsy Kalusa.

NEW ITEMS

We worked on the "values chart" that is part of work being done by Bev Compton and the Twin Valley Strategic Visioning team.

We discussed the topic of background checks for volunteers at VBS or other activities with children. Council members present all reiterated position that BLC should secure background checks for all volunteers that work with children. It was determined that there needs to be much clearer communication on this topic around why we are requesting background checks, what is specifically involved and process steps. Scott to coordinate with Pastor, Lisa Nakata and Melisa Nusbaum to have clear communication document provided.

We discussed logistics for upcoming Council retreat to be held on 6/23 from 9a-1pm at the home of Beverly Compton. Our primary focus of discussion will be on identifying key congregational goals and how we plan to ensure continuing effort and measurement. Next step is for Scott to collect feedback from Council members' goal recommendations.

There was discussion of bids for phone system for school and church received to date. Council needs more information on the specifics before a decision can be made.

We re-confirmed that 6/10 will be one service as we will have student Confirmations Our 6/20 Council meeting will primarily focus on first draft of 2018-2019 budget

CONFIRMATION CLASSES WILL CONTINUE THIS FALL!

The Confirmation program is a two-year process where students dive deeper into scripture and learn how to ask questions and gain more from God's word. They also learn about Christianity, some of the specifics of the Lutheran tradition (including learning about Luther's Small Catechism), and how they can live out their faith in the world today. The class is combined with other churches in the Twin Valley Conference so it's also an opportunity to make new friends and learn from other pastors and youth directors.

One year of the class is study of the scriptures and one year is a study of their faith and life. At the end of their two-years, students are able to publicly profess their faith during worship and become official voting members of the congregation. Students can start this program as early as 5th grade, but Pastor Megan encourages it for students in middle school. The ideal time for kids to start is 6th grade.

TWIN VALLEY CONFERENCE STRATEGIC VISIONING TEAM

In an effort to strengthen collaboration in regard to investment of time, treasure and talents in our regional ministry. The Twin Valley Team has been tasked with developing and overseeing an effective strategic visioning process utilizing consultants and local expertise, focus groups, workshops and other gatherings and tools. News from our Sponsored Missionaries

It's the rainy season in Tanzania. We live in the northern part of the country where Mount Meru forces rain much of the year



(and at about 20' shy of 15,000', the amount of rain forced is significant). We have some rain in most months of the year, so we didn't know what to expect when the "real" longer rainy season (March-May) began.

Now, as we have learned, there's a reason they call this the "rainy" season. At this point, the rain has been coming steadily for hours every day (and often, every night) for months. At our house, this means that our clothes, which dry on a line on the back porch, are generally damp when we put them on. There is always some mud on the floor, no matter how much cleaning happens. Mold might be found on cloths left too long on tables. And salt, no matter what tricks we play to keep it flowing, has to be dispensed with spoons or fingers. It simply will not come through the tiny holes. The air has been much too wet for much too long.

We're grateful for the rain, despite the inconveniences. This heavy rainy season—which locals call "normal" – is the first "normal" rainy season the area has experienced in a decade. This is because the climate is changing – indeed, it has already changed and the changes keep coming.
