STAR WORD CHECK-IN

People of Bethlehem,

Back at the start of this calendar year, everyone in the congregation had a chance to receive a randomly selected Star Word. I thought that 5 months into the year would be a good time to check in and see how this word has made a difference to you so far this year.

What insight did you get from looking up the definition of your word? Where did you find your word in the Bible? If you've forgotten to look at your word since January or February, there's no need to worry! There's plenty of time left in the year for you to dive deeper into the meaning of the word, into the scriptures, and into ways that God can work in your life through this word.

The word that I received for the year is change. There are over 100 times that the word change appears in the scriptures, so I haven't read through them all yet. One of those passages, however, is from Matthew 18:3 where Jesus says "Truly I tell you, unless you change and become like children, you will never enter the kingdom of heaven." That short verse right there has given me a lot to think about when I focus on my word. What does it mean to change and become like a child? How do I change? How does the Holy Spirit bring about change in me and in my life? Are there ways I can change for the better and how much of that is learning to trust God to guide me and how much of it is proactively working to make those changes myself? That's just a little example of how your word can lead you to look at a passage of scripture in a new and different light. Your word might lead you to some very different ideas.

No matter what your word is, there are many points to consider, there are many directions in which the Spirit will lead you as you discover more about your word and about yourself. Perhaps in searching out your word you'll come across a passage of scripture that will become your new favorite source of strength and comfort. What scripture passages have you found? Has anything been surprising to you? Has anything about your word taken on a greater meaning to you so far this year?

News from our Sponsored Missionaries

Happy Easter! Christ is Risen! It was our honor to participate in the WCC Conference on World Mission and Evangelism, held 20



minutes away from our campus at Ngurdoto Mountain Lodge, one of the few Tanzania venues large enough to host the 1300 delegates and guests of the Conference. This was the largest ecumenical gathering of Christians in the world this year.

These conferences have been very important in the history of world Christianity. The ecumenical movement was born out of these conferences, around 100 years ago. The scandal of divided Christianity was first raised up in these conferences, because the foolishness of divided Christianity became so painfully obvious in the light of the world mission movement.

Following the huge disaster of the two World Wars, it became painfully obvious that the churches had to work together more than ever since the beginning of the Church. The World Council of Churches was founded after WWII out of this missionary movement.

The conference gathered together Christians from all over the world. In addition to plenary addresses and workshops, there were very creative worship services and concerts. There were several choirs from northern Tanzania, along with the drum and dance team from the Cultural Arts Center here at Tumaini University, a drama team, and a couple Maasai Christian choirs.

There were painful times at the conference too. 19th century missions were sometimes done destructively and oppressively. Native communities were destroyed, and missions were sometimes part of that destruction. These Christians were also part of this conference, ready to tell their stories while also celebrating the power of God to bring life out of death, despite the efforts of some other parts of the church.

There is much work left for the global church to do. The existential threat of global warming is continuing and accelerating, and the churches have not yet fully addressed this civilizational crisis. We also have to overcome the deadly struggle against extremist religion that has arisen in the last generation.

More than those, we still don't commune together as Christians. We still cannot come together around the sacrament that Jesus gives us for our unity. It's as if his sacrifice and resurrection aren't enough for us. This scandal for the whole community of believers calls us to prayer and action.
