TO KNOW CHRIST ... TO MAKE CHRIST KNOWN



It feels like so long ago, but it was just earlier this year during Sunday worship that I passed around an offering plate filled with Star Words. Everyone took a paper star with a word on it as their word for the year- a word to look up in Scripture, to pray on, to contemplate. How have things been going with your Star Word so far this year? Have you been praying and thinking about it? Has it encouraged you to think differently about the things you've faced in the past months?

My word for this year was change.

Really, I think if I had gotten any of the words on those stars, it would have given me something interesting to think about for the year, but change has certainly felt like an appropriate word for me this year. I've got my star hanging up on a board on the wall in my office, so I see it every single day. Every day it reminds me to be open to change, to think about change, and to pray about change.

This year we're looking at a big change in my immediate family because we're in the process of being certified as foster parents. That means an additional person in our family, but it also means we have to be ready for change at any given point. A foster child might be a part of our family for just a few months, for a year or so, or for their entire lives. We're working on being prepared for that kind of change and the uncertainty and the excitement that comes with it.

This is also a year of big change for Bethlehem. Since the end of last year we've been in discussions, prayer, worship, and meetings with the members of St. Stephen's Lutheran Church nearby us in Granada Hills. We've been

trying to discern if the Holy Spirit is leading St. Stephen's to merge with Bethlehem and we've been working out what the details would look like. Church members have read documents, attended meetings, and worked together to see how this could be a new and exciting thing for us all.

On September 23rd, members of St. Stephen's voted in favor of the merger, then on September 30th, members of Bethlehem voted in favor of the merger. We have a huge exciting change ahead of us now! Here at Bethlehem, we're going to have some changes- along with the additional church members joining us from St. Stephen's, we'll have Matthew and Suzanne joining our music staff and we'll have Pastor Ioan Ittu joining us as a second pastor here at Bethlehem. We'll have new energy, new ideas, and new people so it's a lot to look forward to.

This also means that here at Bethlehem, we need to really examine and perhaps change some of the ways that we welcome new people and new visitors. Please remember to use the nametags on the welcome table so that people know who you are! Remember to offer a kind and welcoming word to anyone who walks in the door- both familiar and unfamiliar faces. Remember that you do not own your seat in the sanctuary. If someone else sits there, consider it a welcome change for you to experience worship from a different seat! (One of the most unwelcoming things that you could do is to make someone feel like they have to worry about where they sit- so I implore you to truly be open-minded about your seat!) In fact, you should offer to sit next to people who are new to you or invite them to sit with you. It's a great way to make new friends and to help someone else feel less alone. We're all in this together!

There's a lot of change coming up and change can be good!

So let's go ahead celebrating the good that change brings, but also with open minds and open hearts, knowing that it can also be difficult (especially for the people of St. Stephen's, who are leaving their beloved building and congregation to merge with us- be kind and sensitive to the change they're going through), but that even with the potential challenges, there is a lot of wonderful ministry ahead of us!

SUMMARY OF BETHLEHEM COUNCIL MINUTES – SEPTEMBER 19, 2018

Present at the meeting were Pastor Megan, Scott Fisher, Sarah Karzel, Bev Compton, Lisa Nakata, Betsy Kalusa, Nicole Hernandez-Liva, and Donna Ophus. Pastor Megan opened with devotions and prayer followed by approval of council minutes from 7/25/18, 8/22/18, and 9/9/18.

Sarah presented three documents - "Summary of Discussions Concerning the Merger", "Agreement Between St. Stephens Lutheran Church and Bethlehem Lutheran Church Regarding Endowment Funds in connection with their Merger", and "Agreement of Merger". There followed a discussion of these documents and how the challenges of this merger have been dealt with over the last months.

Pastor Megan, Scott, and Sarah met with St. Stephens council on September 17 and reported to the council on that meeting. After much discussion it was decided that any decisions relative to the merger would be made at the next council meeting. (*see below) There will be a merger vote by the congregation on September 30.

There has been a request for use of space at BLC by Boy Scout and Cub Scout troops that are currently meeting at St. Stephens. These meetings would be weekly on Tuesday evenings and two Saturday meetings per year. There will be further issues to be considered which will be clarified with the troop leader.

Pastor Megan reported that Gaga will be joining BLC as a member and this was happily approved by the council. * Pastor Megan also requested clarity on child care costs for her, Pastor Megan's, new foster child when this occurs. Bev will clarify this with the preschool. * Betsy will meet with the person responsible for the St. Stephens boutique sale to be held on November 10. I'm sure they will welcome any additional participation by BLC members!





News from our Sponsored Missionaries

Greetings to you all from Columbus, Ohio! We are in the US during the break between academic years, spending time



with our children and handling business that is very much easier to address from a US address. As we prepared to come stateside, we took part in two important conferences for which the ELCA took a leadership role: the ELCA/ELCT Bishops' Summit, and the 1st Annual International African Lutheran Conference. We were grateful to take part as observers. These conferences evoked deep gratitude and raised deep questions about a central issue for our work: What does it mean to be in relationship, to be brothers and sisters, with people whose lives, cultures, and experience of church are so very different? Or, more simply: What is it to be in mission today?

In his opening address to the Bishops' Summit, ELCT Presiding Bishop the Rev. Dr. Frederick Shoo stated that "Companionship is not for the weak, nor the faint of heart." The ELCA's Companion Synod program, begun decades ago with ELCT dioceses and now encompassing churches around the world, includes 20 companion relationships between US and Tanzania. All the bishops involved from the US and Tanzania were invited to take part, along with representatives from their dioceses or synods. There are six ELCT dioceses which do not have ELCA companion synods; bishops from these newer dioceses also took part.




