The school is an outreach to quite a bit of the community through the families of the kids attending and the fun open events throughout the year. We sponsor missionaries in Tanzania who help teach students there (look further in the newsletter for information on how to meet the missionaries this month!). We reach out through donations of items, money, and time to Lutheran Social Services. Over the years we've done things like cook meals for families in a shelter, collect Angel Tree gifts for kids for Christmas, packed food for those in need, raised money for Hope Gardens to help women & children living there, hosted the Downs Syndrome Associate Dance, and so much more. We are called to constantly be thinking about ways we could do even more than we already have.

On September 8th from 2-4 pm, we'll be taking part in God's Work Our Hands Sunday. This is a Sunday each year when ELCA congregations are especially intentional about going out and serving others. This year we're doing this in coordination with several other congregations in our area (we're all a part of the Twin Valleys Conference). We'll be going to St. Luke's Lutheran Church in Woodland Hills and helping clean up in the neighborhood and/or tie blankets for those in need that will be distributed at St. Matthew's in North Hollywood and Central in Van Nuys. Put this event on your calendar because it's one more way that we can reach out and go beyond the walls of our building, following God's call to love and care for everyone!

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SUMMARY OF BETHLEHEM COUNCIL MINUTES – JULY 10, 2019

Present at the meeting were Pastors Megan Fryling, Pastor Ioan Ittu, Sarah Karzel, Sue Akin, Brian Grefsrud, Janet Puchlik, Beverly Compton, Lisa Nakata, and Mary Fisher.

Devotions and prayer were shared by Brian. The June minutes were not reviewed.

TOPICS:

Custodial Contract Adjustments

Meny is a contractor to the church and school. He requested an increase in pay to \$1600 per month from his current total compensation of \$1,344. Increase was approved.

2019/2020 Budget/Cash on Hand

Brian presented the budget for further review leading up to the congregational review. Council approved the budget for presentation to the congregation at the annual budget meeting scheduled for August 18. In addition, Brian told the group that over the past few years, the church has accumulated \$300,000 in cash. Options for spending cash on hand were discussed. Upcoming expenses were discussed, including repairs to the parking lot. Ultimately, council decided to recommend to the congregation that we pay off the mortgage. The current balance is \$163,000, the interest rate is 5.5%, and the monthly payment is \$26,000.

Eagle Scout Project

Pastor Ioan reported on proposed Eagle Scout project to add a "tiny library" near the parking lot entry on Jolette and near the preschool entry. This is a community library that encourages people to both borrow and contribute books.

Changes to Constitution and Bylaws

Sarah presented an addition to the bylaws. The purpose is to add language to govern the way the new Faithful Stewards Endowment is managed and used to support ministry. The addition was approved for submission to the congregation at the August 18th meeting.

Counters Council discussed the shortage of members willing to count offerings. Only a very few are willing, and it is resulting in burn out for those who are. We have at least one couple who is willing to count but only if they can do so together. We have a policy against family members counting together, consistent with ELCA best practices. In light of the shortage, council thought it appropriate to suspend the policy temporarily while we search for other solutions.

The meeting was adjourned with a prayer.

The next meeting will be on August 21st. Lisa Nakata was asked to prepare the devotion for that meeting.

MEET VICENTE DITTO, SENIOR MUSIC DIRECTOR

Vicente James Ditto-Copeland was named after his two grandfathers. His maternal ancestors were English/Scotch/Irish pilgrims who came to this country on the Mayflower, and two who participated in the War for Independence. "The names Vicente and Ditto come from my father's family, which emigrated to Ecuador from southern Italy in the first half of the 20th century," he explains. "The branch of the family that stayed in Ecuador maintained the Italian last name of Ditto, but started using Spanish first names for those born in South America." Vicente is a Santa Monica-born Californian who was baptized in sixth grade and attended Catholic school. His mother forced piano lessons on him as a youngster, but eventually he came to appreciate being able to play. Interest in the performing arts

began in high school, where he also sang in the chorus. For a while he imagined he would be a conductor, but in the process of earning a Bachelor of Arts degree in Music from the University of Rochester in New York, he let go of that idea.

One Christmas Eve, Vicente was called in to substitute for the pianist at Bethlehem Lutheran Church. As a result, he landed the job of accompanist here. Since 2007, he served as Co-Director of Music. Following the merger with St. Stephen's in the Fall of 2018, he was made Senior Music Director. He also holds staff accompanist positions at the Oakwood Secondary School and American Musical and Dramatic Academy (AMDA).

Vicente enjoys games with friends, Mexican food and, though he's a wine enthusiast, he doesn't profess to be an expert. Bethlehem has been treated to his fine skills as a thespian, most recently during Lent in the role of the wickedly humorous prosecuting attorney in "*The Trial of Jess Goodnuff*".

He believes what attracts people to a church, perhaps more than music, is a communal feeling. He has identified three things that people at Bethlehem like: message, music and socializing.

"Visitors would find Bethlehem to be a welcoming congregation," says Vicente, "with entertaining events, a nice preschool, people with fun personalities, and a commitment to helping support Lutheran Social Services."

Recently, he had an opportunity to visit other churches to do research on their styles. One impressed him with its strong commitment to social justice, which permeated the service. He notes that going out into the community is one area that could be strengthened at Bethlehem and he hopes this will be a church that stays open to survive another generation.

Vicente has no reservations about the merger and feels it is going well. He likes having the section

leaders in the choir since they help the members do more advanced, complex music. A new digital sound system will be installed soon. It includes speakers in several locations, screens for the contemporary service, microphones and head sets. One more thing Vicente would welcome is if people would share their opinions with him about music matters.

Serious by nature, Vicente is intrigued by the mystery of Christianity—the idea of the Trinity. You'll have to find out from Vicente himself why his favorite Bible story is of the courageous woman Jael, recorded in Judges, ch. 4. The unusual (but gruesome) story is not one you're likely to hear in the Sunday readings, but it teaches some powerful lessons worth remembering:

- 1. Act on the opportunities God puts in front of you.
- 2. Use the tools you've been given.

3. Some things are more important than following rules.

Our highest motive should be honoring God.

AUGUST NEWS FROM LUTHERAN SOCIAL SERVICES

Hard to believe it's August already! LSS San Fernando Valley is making plans for the rest of the year, and here are a few dates for you: October/November: We will be collecting Thanksgiving Food for our Thanksgiving give-a-way. Thanksgiving is November 28th, we will collect the food through Sunday, November 24th, with our give-a-way on Monday and Tuesday, November 25th and 26th. Suggested food items are canned veggies, boxed potatoes, bagged rice, boxed dressing, pasta, canned mixed fruit, cake mix, coffee, pumpkin filling, sugar, hot cocoa, chicken broth. In addition, if you know of a family that needs a Thanksgiving basket, be sure to let us know.

November/December: We will be collecting toys for our annual Toy Give-a-Way for low income/no income families ages infant to 12 years of age, boys and girls. The Toy Give-a-Way will be Saturday, December 14th. We will need all toys by Monday, December 9th. If you and/or your kids are interested in helping being "Santa's elves" that day, please let us know.

This month we served over 550 families and individuals with food, clothes, hygiene items, household items and resources, thanks to all of you. We also started a new Older Adult Food Program for seniors 60 and older. In addition to the regular food they would receive from the Food Pantry, they also now receive another box of food with non-perishable items such as peanut butter, canned tuna, canned chicken, low sodium veggies, fruit in juice, oatmeal, raisins, soft granola bars, shelf stable milk, whole grain cereal, pasta and sauce, low sodium beans and more.....thanks to a grant from the LA Regional Food Bank. MERGER MATTERS: SUBSIDIZING TRANSITION COSTS; SECURING THE FUTURE WITH AN ENDOWMENT FUND

The merger of two congregations is not as simple as just making room for a few more people in the pews. In the case of Bethlehem and St. Stephen's, there was additional staff, equipment, files, supplies and space needs, new money, new ministries and new dreams to accommodate.

To assist in this transition, \$400,000 from the sale of the St. Stephen's property was set aside for the extra costs involved and to fulfill some items on Bethlehem's "wish list." The Synod recommended ear-marking another \$400,000 for a charitable tithe (and 29 applications for grants were received for many worthy projects). These funds were placed in a safe, low-interest, easy-to-access Mission Investment Fund.

The remainder from the sale, \$3.3 million, was placed in a new endowment fund, which will generate about \$150,000 each year for our new dreams and vision. The fund was named the "Faithful Stewards Endowment Fund" based on I Peter 4:10 (NIV) "...use whatever gift you have received to serve others..." Neither the principal nor the income produced is intended to be used for salaries or operating expenses. For those things, regular giving must step up to the new challenges and opportunities before us, and the sooner the better.

At this moment -- with two gifted pastors, five talented music staff, four choir section leaders, an office assistant, new bookkeeper, new administrator, over 120 regular Sunday worshipers, a fine preschool and additional liquid assets -- Bethlehem Lutheran Church is strategically positioned to take the next step to an increased level of mission and ministry! Think of the possibilities for growing spiritually, serving the community and getting new people acquainted with God's love and light!

In addition to Bethlehem's vice president and pastors, who are automatically members of any endowment team, six former St. Stephen's members were appointed to manage the Faithful Stewards Endowment Fund through 2019 and keep the congregation informed about how it is being used. The former president of St. Stephen's, Greg Imlay, was elected chairperson and the former council secretary, Marilyn Fursman, was elected recorder of the new endowment fund team. Other members included former St. Stephen's treasurer Dianne Tillman, former St. Stephen's council member Lee Underwood, former head usher Ken Cave and North Valley YMCA Director Jane Stanton.

This year, \$171,000 was authorized for the following: a new grand piano (\$51,000), three storage sheds and a multipurpose/office bungalow (\$45,000), church air conditioning (\$40,000), Audio Video system (\$35,000). In actuality, some of these things cost more than anticipated and the bungalow was removed from the list.

Additionally, \$214,000 was ear-marked for certain budgeted items for 2019, including Pr. Ioan Ittu's salary (at 3/4-time for the first year), the worship program, an administrator, evangelism, youth and young adults, educational training, council discretionary fund, and pastors' discretionary funds.

Because pledges were not enough to cover the 2020 Proposed Budget, the council has request \$150,500 for staffing and ministry support. On the positive side, \$7,000 in matching funds was approved for the youth to attend the 2021 National Youth Gathering and \$2,000 was approved to tune the bells for Grace Notes Bell Choir.

Proposed Bylaws governing the new endowment fund will be voted on by the congregation.

The old attitude of we give our money to the church and trust it goes to good use is no longer part of a younger generation's thinking. This thought has me pondering on all the immense and amazing things our offering does for us at Bethlehem and in spreading the Gospel to our community and beyond.

I begin by looking at our fantastic staff. Pastor Megan and Pastor Ioan are there for us no matter what. They are willing to interrupt schedules and their family lives to be there for us in joy, sorrow, prayer, and love. The music staff is outstanding. Think about the hours and effort they put forth to provide us with an inspiring worship experience and more. Evelyn in the office is kind and helpful. Now we have a new administrator to get to know and love.

The next thought is the great programs we have. Of course, one of my favorites is Evangelism. The ability to reach out into the community with our love through marketing and gifts such as the Easter plants is wonderful. Reaching out through VBS was awesome. Supporting missionaries gives us insight into a world beyond our own. The new possibilities such as a Conference Parish are thrilling. It is only through serving on the Stewardship Team have I stopped to think about how important it is to realize all the good things that our offerings provide. Take a minute to remember what a blessing your offering can mean.
