Thank you for your pledges of time, talent and treasure. Your pledges will help Bethlehem's leadership determine the scope of our ministry in the upcoming year. Thank for all you've done and will continue to do as part of God's church.

So, what will we do with your generosity? At an evangelism meeting we discussed that evangelism is so much more than advertising. The work of evangelism is introducing people to the love of God. With your generosity, Bethlehem will create more impactful ways for God to meet us and meet those who have yet to fully know the love of their friend God.

One of my friends in Seminary thought of himself as a punk monk. He had a regimented daily prayer life and lived very simply. But he was also in a punk band, and dispensed sage wisdom between acts to guys with face tattoos and safety pins through their lower lip. He finds that God meets people in 4 different ways: Praise, Contemplation, Study and Service.

Praise is when our emotions get engaged as we feel God's love for us in prayer and singing. Contemplation is a bit more cerebral where we meditate on God's love for us through sermons, hymns and rituals. Study is for those who feel closest to God's love when they are learning something about God or God's world or our purpose in God's world. Service is for those who feel God's love most powerfully when they are tangibly helping another person or helping make the world a safer and more just place for others.

Our contemporary worship with its prayer and praise worship style helps us feel God's love as we sing to God. Our traditional worship and choir ministry helps us meditate on the depth of God's love. You are engaged heart and head at both services in high quality and meaningful ways that communicate God's love in a style of your preference. For those who meet God in learning, we have Wednesday Study, WELCA Study, and Sunday Study. For those who meet God through compassionate love for the neighbor, our social ministry helps with LSS, food pantry donations, Mexico home builds, our international missionaries and much more. Our evangelism ministry tries to bring the love of our church to new people. And we also serve each other caring for people already in the congregation through our visitation, fellowship and youth ministries. We are a robust congregation that offers a wide range of ways for God's love to meet people where they are and as they need. And all this is only possible because of your generosity. Thank you.

SUMMARY OF BETHLEHEM COUNCIL MINUTES – MAY 15, 2019

Present at the meeting were Pastors Megan Fryling and Ioan Ittu, Sarah Karzel, Sue Akin, Brian Grefsrud, Janet Puchlik, Marilyn Fursman (part), and Mary Fisher.

Devotions were shared by Mary, followed by a prayer by Pastor Megan. The May minutes were reviewed and approved as presented.

TOPICS

June 9th Round Table Discussion

Sarah shared a debrief of the responses that were shared at the round table. The majority of participants agreed that Music Ministry and having two Pastors are our two most important assets and that they are both necessary for the growth of other ministries. Other ideas that came out of the session – the desire for a photo directory for the congregation, and a reminder that everyone should put first and last names on name tags on Sundays.

Tithe Discussion

Marilyn Fursman shared information on the requests that were made for grants from the St. Stephens endowment fund, to come out of the portion of the short term fund set aside for a tithe. Twenty nine requests were received and are currently under consideration.

Marilyn also submitted a specific resolution on behalf of our congregation as a recipient. She identified certain areas that are obstacles to growth, (such as a shortage of meeting spaces for adults, lack of professional office space, no permanent storage space, no sacristy, the sound quality in the fellowship hall, clear signage, the need for expanded social media presence) and proposed that all or some of the funds be used to address these issues. The council voted to approve use of the funds (if granted) per the resolution.

<u>Budget</u>

Brian presented the budget for preliminary review.

The meeting was adjourned with a prayer. The next meeting will be on July 10.







PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Dear Fellow Bethlehem Members,

At a recent Council meeting, a question arose as to why some of our members were apparently unaware that we had planned our Stewardship campaign for June. We had sent out an email several weeks before. Pastor Megan quickly pulled up her Mail Chimp app and reported that 63% of the congregation had opened that email. She added that 63% is a fairly normal number for Bethlehem emails and above average for congregations over all.

When I took on this role in January, I knew that communication was an issue. It's an issue in every organization. We had added council minutes to the newsletter some years before. We added the weekly email a few years later. I naively thought that adding this message to the newsletter would help alleviate the problem. I continue to hear, though, with about the same frequency, "How come I didn't know about X."

At the round table discussions on June 9, I heard lots of great suggestions about lots of things, including communication. What struck me was the degree to which the suggestions differed. They ranged from robocalls to Facebook posts to more announcements in the services. So what that means to me is that different methods will reach different members. But what adds an additional level of difficulty is that one person's favorite method is an aggravation to others.

So we will continue to try to refine our communication tools. I'm wishing right now that I had a degree in communications. Maybe one of you out there does. STEWARDSHIP LETTER

Dear Fellow Members of Bethlehem,

Last Sunday was Pledge Sunday! I loved the act of bringing our pledges forward to the front of the church. It reinforced for me the pledge as an act of faith and as a confirmation of our congregation as a community working together. Forty-eight other families joined Ron and me in coming forward with our pledges. It was great to be part of this group of generous souls. I am confident there are more of you who were not there Sunday and have not yet made your pledges, but we look forward to receiving them.

With regard to the pledges of treasure, I want to let you know where we are and how the process works. So far, our pledges total about \$185,000. This is a tremendous expression of faith. As I said above, I know there are more of you out there who have not yet pledged, and we know from experience that some of you who don't pledge will nonetheless give generously and consistently. The first draft of our budget for 2019/2020 included total estimated giving of \$295,000. This reflects a modest increase from our combined giving over the last few years. You all know how budgets work; if we are not able to get to an estimate of \$295,000, based on pledges and our best guess as to unpledged giving, then cuts will have to be made to ministries.

Estimating giving will be a little more challenging this year than it has been in the past because of the merger. And that is why I'd like to ask you again to take that extra step of making a pledge. It will feel good (I promise), and it will enable the council to produce a more accurate budget.

JULY NEWS FROM LUTHERAN SOCIAL SERVICES

A STORY:

Bricia left Veracruz, Mexico at the age of 19. It took her one year to save enough money to cross the border, alone, into the United States. She had four sisters living with her Mom and a step-father. Her Mom was jealous of all of her sisters and herself because of the attention their step-father gave all of the girls, and was emotionally abusive. She said she was contemplating killing herself or leaving her family home. Thankfully, she decided on the latter.

When she got to the U.S. she was taken in by an aunt on her Mother's side and lived with her aunt for 7 years. During that time, she worked at an animal kennel in Sun Valley, cleaning cages and grooming dogs and cats. She worked 7 days a week from 7 a . m. to 6 p.m. for 9 years for below minimum wage all those years.

She eventually moved out of her aunt's apt. and into a singles apt. house. She met her husband, Eduardo, while living there when he was visiting his mother. Bricia knew his mother for several years before that, and she lived two doors down from her. They met on a Sunday and were married one month later. They have three sons, Gustavo, 18, Carlos, 16 and Diego, 13. Gustavo is a special needs adult.

Bricia first came to LSS when she saw the doors open on Valerio Street and thought that the church was re-opening. She had attended Iglesias San Pablo several times in the past and was excited to think it was re-opening again. When she entered, she saw the LSS thrift shop and food pantry, and that was the beginning of her coming to what she calls "The Mall."

Bricia's family is food insecure. With 4 full grown adult men in the house, she never has enough food. For breakfast, she cooks a full meal of pancakes, sometimes eggs if she can afford them or if LSS has them. Her husband goes to work, her sons to school, and she does not pack anything for lunch for them because she does not have enough food in the house to do so. When everyone gets home around 4, they are all starving, and she begins their dinner, mostly consisting of beans, veggie, potatoes and a little meat. She says that LSS has helped her immensely with food – bread, dairy products, chicken, pork patties, veggies and the thing her family loves the most is when LSS has desserts – cookies, cakes, fruit – things they could never afford to buy. Oh – and chips – don't forget the chips!

Bricia's family also shops at our Thrift Store almost exclusively for both herself, her sons and her husband. They cannot afford to go to a Macy's or Penney's, so they use our Thrift Store to buy their clothes, shoes and jackets for both work, play and school.

There are hundreds of Bricia's that come to LSS – and thanks to all of you, through your donations, we have become a community for each and every family and individual.
