SUMMARY OF BETHLEHEM COUNCIL MINUTES – MAY 15, 2019

Present at the meeting were Pastor Megan, Pastor Ioan, Sarah Karzel, Janet Puchlik, Brian Grefsrud, Bev Compton, Lisa Nakata, Connie Troe, and Donna Ophus.

Bev opened the meeting with devotions and prayer. The minutes from the April 17, 2019, meeting were approved as presented.

There was approval of \$830.60 to be reimbursed to Pastor Megan out of the "council discretionary fund" for flight costs of our missionaries, Rev. Cynthia Holder Rich and Rev. Mark Rich, for their flight to California. \$1,800 was approved to come out of the "council discretionary fund" for a "Mental Health Aid" course that will be made available to members of the congregation.

After some discussion there was an inability to schedule a council retreat in June at a time when enough members could be present. The regular June council meeting will be June 19. Mary Fisher will be responsible for devotions at that meeting.

Sarah held a meeting with members of the congregation, answering questions and addressing their concerns.

Bev reported on her involvement over the past year in the Twin Valleys Strategic Visioning Team/Twin Valley Parish. A consultant, Kate Chatek, has been hired. Kate arrived at the council meeting and presented what the conference has been planning with a coalition of 7 congregations and what this all means for the Lutheran congregations within our area. A parish structure would be set up to accomplish the plan of the visioning team. On June 8, at Bethel, a vote will be taken to continue moving forward with the parish plan. This vote is not a commitment at this point but is a vote to continue working on the process.

The council authorized Bev to vote "yes" at the June 8 meeting, in establishment of an interim board. The interim board will then develop a "Memorandum of Understanding" (MOU), at which point another vote will take place to review the MOU and determine the path going forward and the level of commitment.

Pastor Megan closed the meeting with prayer.

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Dear Fellow Members of Bethlehem,

First, thank you to those of you who took the time to meet with me on May 7 to discuss money matters. We talked about the merger, the endowment from the sale of the St. Stephen's property (recently named the Faithful Stewards Endowment Fund!) and the choices that will need to be made about where to focus our resources going forward. These conversations were very helpful as we head into budget preparation over the next couple of months. If you missed that session, not to worry. On June 9, there will be round table conversations after the combined 10 a.m. service that day. We will talk about some of the same issues about how money is being spent and how the gift of the endowment affects us. We will take a little time to dream together about how the proceeds of the endowment can be used to build our future and to advance our ministries. I look forward to seeing you all there.

June 9 is also the beginning of our Stewardship Drive. As you know, we have not had an organized stewardship effort for over a year. We will be focusing on time, talent and treasure. We hope it will be a time to prayerfully consider how best to connect to your church and to your community in a meaningful way.

Let me share a few updates:

<u>Faithful Stewards Endowment (FSE) Bylaws</u> – At the time of the merger, we thought we might, for the sake of efficiency, combine the new endowment with our existing MEF endowment. After some discernment, we concluded that in order to honor the MEF donors and their wishes, the funds should be kept separate. The Endowment Committee that has been overseeing FSE this year is working on Bylaws to govern the management, investment and dispersal of the fund. These Bylaws will be submitted to the congregation for a vote at the August budget meeting.

<u>Tithe</u> – The former Council of St. Stephen's pledged to use 10% of the proceeds of the sale of the church property immediately to support ministry in our community. They are considering proposals from a variety of organizations and causes and plan to reach a decision in July.

<u>Back Hall Construction Project</u> – Our Property and Grounds Chair, Gerry Puchlik, has prepared drawings that the city requires for the project and has met with the city to start the approval process. The goal is to transform the currently dark and cluttered space into a bright and welcoming flexible meeting space for both youth and adults. We are now looking for bids from contractors. If you know of someone who could take on the job, let me or Gerry or Evelyn know.

Getting to Know You: Pr. Megan Hunt Fryling

Born in Ohio, Megan Hunt grew up Lutheran in Michigan, graduating from Hope College in Holland, Michigan with a Bachelor of Arts degree in English Literature, with an emphasis on Creative Writing. She earned her Master of Divinity degree, with an emphasis on Multicultural Concentration, from The Lutheran Theological Seminary at Philadelphia. Pr. Fryling has served as pastor at Bethlehem Lutheran Church since October 2014.

Before coming to Bethlehem, Pr. Fryling worked for six months at Prince of Peace Lutheran Church in Covina, coordinating small groups by interests. Before that she served about a year-and-a-half as pastor at Grace Lutheran Church in Covina.

In 2009, she served as a chaplaincy intern at Artman Lutheran Home in Ambler, Pa., where Rev. Linda Hatcher, said of her: "Megan is a pastor at heart. This was evidenced by the way she interacted with the residents here at Artman. She was deeply caring and insightful as she was able to provide spiritual care in ways in which it spoke to each individual....She has a gift for reaching people where they are...." Bethlehem members have described her as friendly and compassionate and especially good in one-on-one situations.

After graduating from college, she was unsure of what to do. In hindsight, it seems clear that God was preparing the path that led her to pastoral ministry. The Global Mission Department of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA) helped her connect with the Amity Foundation, which hired her to work in Guangxi Province, China, from 2006 to 2008. She was employed to teach English, British and American Culture, and British Literature.

While in China, she met Kyle Fryling; they became engaged there and married soon after returning to the U.S. Kyle's job with World Vision International takes him all over the world. World Vision is a global Christian relief, development and advocacy organization dedicated to working with children, families and communities to overcome poverty and injustice. They have a four-year-old son, Desmond, and are foster parents to another child as well.

She has worked at Concordia Junior/Senior High School in Sylmar teaching English to visiting Chinese students and at Green Planet, also in Sylmar, helping international students adjust to life in the United States.

She has studied the history of opera in Vienna, Austria; interned at National Public Radio (NPR) in Philadelphia; had training in Mandarin Chinese and French. Pr. Fryling loves poetry, music, concerts and gardening; but she has a real passion for tea—all types of tea.



Pr. Fryling says the best part about being a pastor is "the cool conversations with kids about faith." She believes the excellent music and engaging, interesting members will draw new people to Bethlehem. Her hopes for the merged church are for growth, increased outreach and a membership which, like the preschool, better reflects the ethnic groups in the neighborhood.

As a seminary student, her insight into the Church in transition still rings true today: "A time of transition can be scary because it leaves us in this balance between one thing and the next, this uneven ground. However, when we remind ourselves that God is present with us in this transition, it is something entirely different. The Holy Spirit works with us as we strive to share the good news of Christ with those around us, even when we're feeling uncertain. Maybe we don't know where we're going, but when we remember the transforming power of Jesus Christ, we know that he can bring a period of transition into a time of great and wonderful transformation."
