SUMMARY OF BETHLEHEM COUNCIL MINUTES – FEBRUARY 20, 2019

Present at the meeting were Pastor Ioan, Sarah Karzel, Janet Puchlik, Brian Grefsrud, Bev Compton, Lisa Nakata, Connie Troe, Sue Akin, Mary Fisher, and Donna Ophus.

Sarah opened the meeting with a reflection on "Servant Leadership" followed by prayer and introduction of the new council members. Pastor Ioan gave instructions on the use of Google Drive for council to present reports and communicate by email. The January 16, 2019, minutes were unanimously adopted as presented.

Pastor Ioan spoke on stewardship plans for 2019. It is expected that the year's giving will be adequate to meet this year's needs. After discussion it was decided that a stewardship program will begin in mid-May with pledges being received by July. Several people were named as possibly being part of the planning. Sarah expressed the need for long range planning for BLC. Pastor Ioan projects that five years from now there may be a need for additional giving to cover expenses.

Gerry Puchlik has offered to take on the position of management of Building and Grounds. The council unanimously voted to accept this offer.

Use of the sanctuary/facility for recitals, parties, etc. was discussed. Vicente put together a proposal for outside use of the sanctuary. The proposal is as follows -

- 1. Music groups not associated with any music staff member will not be allowed to use the sanctuary.
- 2. Groups that are associated with a music staff member are allowed to use the sanctuary as long as a music staff member is present to supervise during the entirety of the outside group's event.
- 3. A negotiable recommended donation from the outside group will be determined by the music staff member overseeing the event. \$200 is the current default for a recommended donation.
- 4. Music staff member will not be compensated for their time supervising an outside group's event unless they negotiate payment directly from the outside group.

The council unanimously approved Vicente's proposal.

Brian reported that he met with Karen Meier (bookkeeper) and went over what has been done in the past. She will work on Saturdays and estimates that the time needed will be five hours per week.

Pastor Ioan reported that \$400,000 from the sale of St. Stephen's will be tithed. St. Stephens' council members will look at candidates to receive distributions from this sum. Recipients and sums will be presented at the congregational annual meeting in August.

The meeting was adjourned with prayer.

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Dear Fellow Bethlehem Members,

First, let me thank you for trusting me with this leadership position. It is an exciting time at Bethlehem, filled with potential, some of which has been realized already. It's wonderful to see new relationships formed, shared and enhanced ministries taking shape, and a general air of new enthusiasm. Our goal on the Council is to support the congregation in realizing our potential. Please feel free to contact any of us with questions or concerns. One of our top priorities as we settle into our merger is finding enough space for everyone. I look at it as a great problem to have, but one that needs to be solved nonetheless. We had initially assumed that a modular unit would be the best quick fix. Unfortunately, it turns out not to be quick at all. The permit process with the city would take at least 6 to 9 months and would not be inexpensive. There is some chance, too, that because the modular would go in the parking lot, it would result in the church having too few parking spots, which would require restriping and/or a variance (more time and expense). In the meantime, we are looking at remodeling some space in the center of the facility (sometimes referred to as the "back hallway.") We could get about 260 square feet of usable space out of it (13' x 20'). We foresee using it as a meeting space, for both adults and youth, in the evening and on weekends, and as a break room for teachers during the week. An additional wish list item for this space is another adult restroom.

I want to thank the members of the space planning committee: Sue Akin, Paul St. Michel, Gerry Puchlik, Sam Manual and our Pastors for their thoughtful input.

Another high priority item is finding additional support staff. As you know, we have been operating for the last two years with a very lean staff, and that has made it difficult for our Pastors and church leadership to focus on ministry. During the merger, a portion of the funds from the sale of the St. Stephen's property was committed to pay for administrative staff. We believe our best option, to gain the most flexibility, is to find someone who can work part time to complement Evelyn's skill set and schedule. I have posted the job and am receiving resumes. We hope to have someone in place soon. Finally, you may have noticed that one of our classes of children has been moved to Chandler Hall as work is done on their classroom. We had some water damage during the last heavy rains. Please join me in welcoming Gerry Puchlik to his first week as Property and Grounds Chair. He has had his hands full already!
