We also accomplished numerous administrative and financial goals that support the success of our ministries:

Called Pastor Ittu; Invested \$3.6 million with ELCA Fund A Investment Management; Office Volunteers; Formed the Faithful Stewards Endowment; Stewardship Pledge Drive; Hired a New Business Administrator; Budget Growth by \$150,000; Loan Paid-Off; Pastor Megan's 5 Year Anniversary.

What has blossomed since then is a joyful energy for moving forward together toward a brighter future.

SUMMARY OF BETHLEHEM COUNCIL MINUTES – OCTOBER 2, 2019

Present: Beverly Compton, Lisa Nakata, Pr. Megan Fryling, Pastor Ioan Ittu, Sarah Karzel, Mary Fisher, Janet Puchlik, and Connie Troe. Brian Grefsrud attended telephonically.

The meeting opened with a devotion and prayer led by Lisa Nakata.

Minutes from the August meeting were approved with two changes.

School Property Issues: Council approved the following expenditures proposed by BLESS:

- -Shed for BLESS storage not to exceed \$1,200
- -Teacher wish list not to exceed \$1,600
- -Infant play structure not to exceed \$5,000.
- -School age STEM not to exceed \$300.

Council also agreed with the plan to keep \$10,000 in BLESS account. A larger plan for the improvement of the back play yard is in development. It will be reviewed and approved by Council and then by the congregation.

<u>Room Rental Request</u>: A new AA related group has requested weekly meeting space. Unfortunately, Council did not feel we could reasonably accommodate them.

<u>Ministry Review</u>: As we approach our one year anniversary of combined ministry, Pastor Megan has asked the council to engage in a review of our strengths and the use of our resources. She introduced us to the ideas and encouraged us to think and plan for a more complete analysis and discussion at our annual retreat, planned for January 18, 2020.

The next meeting is scheduled for October 23.

MEET THE MEMBERS: PAMELA (MRS. PATRICK) SHEA

On a memorable spring day not long ago, Village Poets of Sunland-Tujunga announced that Pamela Shea, left, a long-time local resident, was elected the Sunland-Tujunga Poet Laureate for 2017-2019. She officially received her laurels on April 23, 2017, at

the McGroarty Arts Center in Tujunga, Calif.

How does one get to be a Poet Laureate? "By submitting your work to be reviewed by a panel," she explains.

The ninth Poet Laureate of Sunland-Tujunga says, "I represent the community through the arts." Mrs. Shea was a featured reader at the Shouting Coyote Performing Festival and led a workshop at that event on the Poetry of Nature. She has participated in many readings with the Wide Open Readers and the Village Poets of Sunland-Tujunga at Bolton Hall Museum. The Village Poets of Sunland Tujunga is a group comprised of the current and former Poets Laureate of Sunland-Tujunga, who organize poetry readings in the community, write poetry, publish books, and keep poetry alive in the Foothills. Her poems have appeared in the local Voice of the Village newspaper, online in Village Poets and in Poetry Laurels blogs.

Born and raised in the foothills community of La Crescenta, she has been writing poetry since she was a shy youngster; it was a way to get her feelings out and to chronicle her life's experiences.

She studied at the University of Redlands, is retired from medical office work, but still teaches fitness classes (aerobics) at the Verdugo Hills YMCA. Besides writing, she enjoys gardening and community service including volunteering for several years for the Verdugo Hills Family YMCA's annual Campaign Support Fund Drive. She was also a member of VHY's Senior Advisory Committee. She started a poetry group that met weekly at VHY, and served as a board

member for the Health Ministries of the Foothills. She has also been involved in the Relay for Life and is a member of the Sylmar Women's Club, which raises funds for educational scholarships.

Married to Patrick for 45 years, the energetic and friendly woman is the mother of three and grandmother of two. Although she feels she has had a fairly charmed life, there were some disappointments along the way; however, being a person of faith — which is such a part of her identity — has helped her through the challenging times.

"Don't let disappointments discourage you;" she advises, "trust that there is a bigger plan."

She attended Salem Lutheran Church in Glendale until about a year-and-a-half ago when she transferred to Bethlehem to be closer to her daughter, Laureen Gleason, and her two grandchildren, Paige and Shea.

When she first saw Pr. Ioan Ittu on the campus at Bethlehem, she took it as a sign that this is where she was supposed to be, as she had known him years ago when he was a student in her daughter's confirmation class at Salem. She is pleased to see how gospelcentered his sermons are. She finds Pr. Megan Fryling to be someone with a caring heart and very approachable.

What keeps her coming to Bethlehem is the focus on Christ, the acceptance of the members, and there's a good balance of contemporary and traditional music. She likes the new bell choir and recently joined. She's also involved in leading children's music.

Her theory on church growth is that people must be open to new ways of doing things. She'd like to see more partnering with neighborhood schools.

Asked for some words to live by, she offers this: "Do what you love, with as much energy as you can muster, for as long as you can."




