SAFETY TIPS FROM INTER-LUTHERAN EMERGENCY RESPONSE TEAM

Earthquake Preparedness & Safety

OCTOBER MONTHLY TRAINING TOPIC

Earthquakes happen without warning. We don't know when the next major earthquake will happen, but we can take action now to prepare to survive it and minimize impact.

Preparedness starts with a **plan**. For individuals and families, this means putting together an earthquake preparedness plan and kit and knowing what to do before, during, and after an earthquake. **6 Ways to Plan Ahead:**

1. Check for Hazards in the Home

Fasten shelves to walls, put heavy objects on lower shelves, away from beds and sitting areas, brace overhead light fixtures.

2. Identify Safe Places Indoors and Outdoors

Sturdy furniture such as heavy desks and tables, against an inside wall and away from glass and furniture that could fall over.

3. Educate Yourself & Family Members

Contact local emergency management office or Red Cross for more information. Teach all family members when to call 911, which radio station to listen to and when to turn off gas, electricity and water.

4. Have Disaster Supplies on Hand

- Flashlight and extra batteries
- Portable, battery-operated radio and extra batteries
- First aid kit and manual
- Emergency food and water
- Nonelectric can opener
- Essential medicines
- Cash and credit cards
- Sturdy shoes

5. Develop an Emergency Communication Plan

Make a plan for reuniting after the disaster in case family members are separated from one another during an earthquake. Ask an out-of-state relative or friend to serve as the "family contact." After a disaster, it's often easier to call long distance. Make sure everyone in the family knows the name, address, and phone number of the contact person.

I-LERT

The Inter-Lutheran Emergency Response Team is a collaborative ministry between the Pacifica and Southwest California Synods of the Evangelical Lutheran Church of America, and the Pacific Southwest District of the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod.

Our mission is to equip Lutheran congregations and entities to prepare for and respond in the event of a disaster.

6. Help Your Community Get Ready

Work together in your community to apply your knowledge to building codes, retrofitting programs and neighborhood and family emergency plans.

What to Do During and After an Earthquake

If you are indoors, you should drop, cover, and hold - drop to the ground, find cover under a table or sturdy piece of furniture, and hold on until the shaking stops. Stay inside until the shaking has stopped and you are sure exiting is safe. Once outside, move away from buildings to an open space. Get to a safe location and take your kit with you. Check for injuries and hazards, then help others. Follow your plan!

The collection includes rare documents, photographs, vintage neon signs, post cards, yearbooks, negatives, clothing, books, art, automobiles and BMX bikes. The mission of the museum is to preserve and protect local history and artifacts while educating the public on the rich past of The San Fernando Valley and surrounding areas.

Even if you didn't grow up in the Valley, this eclectic facility will prove entertaining. It's not a "regular" museum, but more of a celebration of 20th century pop culture and the objects that were left behind as society moved forward. The website is: valleyrelicsmuseum.org

Please let me know if you are interested in this outing. It will be fun and informative!

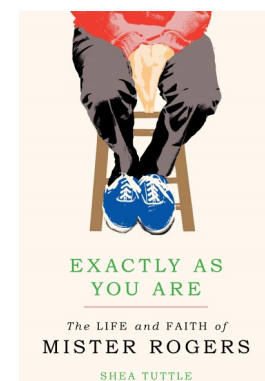
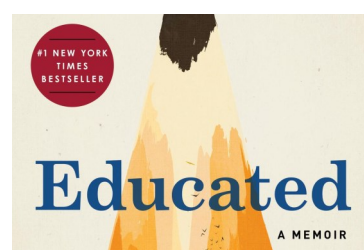

MEET THE MEMBERS: LEE AND SHARI UNDERWOOD

Shari Underwood is California born and bred; Lee moved here from Oregon as a child. Mutual friends introduced the teenagers at a party in Big Bear and five years later they were wed. In the interim, Shari attended UCLA and Lee served in the U.S. Air Force doing aerial photography. Following military service, Lee worked as an animation cameraman for Walt Disney, even helping to make *Sleeping Beauty*.

In 1959 Lee went to work in sales for Shari's dad who owned Ward engineering, a North Hollywood manufacturing and vacuum plating business. Later, Shari became the Chief Financial Officer of the company until it closed in 2003.

Blessed with two sets of fraternal twins (two sons and two daughters) in less than four years, as young parents they made life-long friends with others in the same challenging situation. Now their family has grown to include six grandchildren and one great-grandson.

In the course of their 62-year marriage, they have enjoyed traveling and attained their goal of visiting all 50 states. Part of that was spurred by wanting to meet distant relatives Shari found through her genealogy research. She has said, "Most Europeans do research hoping to find royalty in their family tree, while most Americans get a charge out of finding a horse thief!"

Hosting high school exchange students encouraged an interest in seeing more of the world. Since then they have visited too many countries to list, but highlights surely include spending their 50th anniversary in a tree in Tanzania, Africa; a self-driven boat trip maneuvering through dozens of locks on a canal trip with friends in Southern France; and gathering their large family for a vacation based at a picturesque villa in Tuscany, Italy.

Wine-making became a fun hobby for a number of years and they joined with three other couples to produce zinfandel, merlot and even a gold-medal winning cabernet sauvignon.

Dressing up in western costumes as members of the Owens River Gang, Lee and Shari authentically portrayed a bit of western history for enthusiastic crowds at fairs and the annual Lone Pine Film Festival.

The Underwoods are giving, caring people who, for decades, have been leaders in Optimists International, a service organization that provides education and housing for at-risk teens, which has an impressive track record of preparing young people for productive lives.

At church, Lee has served in numerous leadership roles including on two Call committees, as council vice president and evangelism chair, as a lector, usher, assisting minister and on Cursillo and Via de Cristo spiritual growth weekends. He provided countless barbecues for work parties and fellowship events, participated in chili cook-offs and dramatic presentations and served on the Stained Glass Window Preservation team. At Bethlehem, he's on the new Faithful Stewards Endowment Fund team.

Shari held the post of head usher for many years, provided terrific soups at the annual holiday boutique and helped with every fellowship event. She championed the effort to preserve Roger Darricarrere's award-winning, 40-foot stained glass window at St. Stephen's Lutheran Church, called *Jesus Christ, the Light of the World*. The latter task led her to meet many of the greats in the stained glass window world and gave her an impressive expertise on the subject.

Not originally Lutherans, they were members at St. Stephen's for 52 years. What sold Shari was learning that she was still welcome even after admitting to a new member class that there were some teachings she couldn't go along with. An important Bible verse for her is Mark 9:24, "Lord, I believe, help my unbelief!" Lee likes the story of "doubting Thomas," which reminds us of the blessing for all who believe even without the benefit of convincing evidence.

The Underwoods are happy with their new congregation, even preferring the smaller, cozier environment. These early birds miss hearing the choir, but like the contemporary service at 9 a.m. and the people they've met. Lee's only reservation about the merger is that he feels more attention could be given to evangelism (outreach), as he hopes the church will grow.
