## **SUMMARY OF BETHLEHEM JUNE COUNCIL MINUTES**

#### July Council Highlights Reveal Bethlehem Still has a Lot Going On

#### **ACTIONS:**

- 1. Agreed to send a letter to the congregation, with a copy of the preliminary budget, and explaining that the congregation will meet at a later time to approve a final budget.
- 2. Authorized Treasurer Ruth Irwin, V.P. Janet Puchlik, and Chairperson Janice Maseda to sign the checks for the Thrivent Mission Endowment Fund (MEFT) account.
- 3. Adopted the Corporate Resolution for Thrivent Financial for the Mission Endowment Fund.
- 4. Approved a resolution authorizing Ruth Irwin and Janet Puchlik to be signers on the transitional Mission Investment Fund (a.k.a. the parking lot fund).

#### MANAGEMENT:

- 1. June Income: \$61,048; June Expenses: \$75,456.
- 2. June Offerings: \$16,363 (vs Budget: \$22,545).
- 3. The Thrivent MEFT account had a balance of \$38,239 as of May 31, 2020.
- 4. Discussed several possible ways of holding a congregational budget meeting and agreed it would be best to wait until it can be done safely in person.
- 5. Property: The stained glass overlays on the front windows in the sanctuary are bubbling and cracking, so they are going to be repaired. New member Bob Heyd (Al & Bob Carpets of Granada Hills) will donate installation of carpeting for the new Youth/meeting room.
- 6. One staff member tested positive for Covid-19 and four others self-quarantined for two weeks.
- 7. After much preparation to meet all the Health Dept. protocols for worship (preparing required documents, setting up an RSVP system with contact tracing information, providing masks, gloves, signs, hand sanitizer, distancing markers, and distance seating), in-person worship was offered outdoors at 9 a.m. twice between June 28 and July 19 and twice had to be cancelled. It will be on hold through August. Meanwhile, communion kits will be available for pick-up at the church.
- 8. For the online service, a monthly subscription (\$40/month) was purchased for an app called Switcher Studio that allows integration of pre-recorded segments into live-streaming. It also allows streaming from multiple devices at the same time. This feature would allow some parts to be live-streamed from outside and others from inside, so the staff can spread out and minimize contact with each other.


#### MINISTRY:

- 1. The Worship team continues to provide worship using the streaming process in Facebook Live. In addition, since June 28, in-person worship also is provided outdoors on Sundays at 9 a.m.
- 2. Pr. Megan performed two non-member funerals in the past month.
- 3. Pr. Megan will review new ways to provide a chapel video supplement for the school teachers to use.
- 4. School enrollment continues to increase.
- 5. The Phone Ministry, coordinated by Nancy Hall, continues to be well-received.
- 6 Social Ministry—Mary Fisher will team up with Pr. Stephanie Jaeger to help NoHo Home Alliance for the "God's Work Our Hands Sunday" project in September. In August items will be collected for LSS.
- 7. Virtual Sunday School resumes Sunday, September 13 at 11:30 a.m. via Zoom.
- 8. Staycation Bible School (VBS) took place July 12-16 with 50 children participating via Zoom. Church members created 22 YouTube videos for the campers to watch. Canvas bags decorated by Jill Goddard and filled with supplies were passed out in a drive-through pick-up. Donations raised \$270 for the Hope Gardens Family Facility.
- 9. Youth Group has been meeting twice per week via Zoom. They recently watched the movies "Zootopia" and "The Hate U Give" and discussed how those movies relate to current events and what Jesus says about ministering to the marginalized.
- 10. An Adult Education group is discussing the Rev. Lenny Duncan's challenging book, "Dear Church—A Love-Letter from a Black Preacher to the Whitest Denomination in the U.S," Wednesdays at 6:30 p.m. via Zoom. It's a joint endeavor with Shepherd of the Valley in Simi Valley, facilitated by Pr Jennie Chrien. Bethlehem members of the "Dear Church" study group is working on an art project to hang in Chandler Hall.
- 11. Women of the church meet the third Tuesdays at 4 p.m., via Zoom, to study a summer series called "Just Love."

## WINDOW REPAIR WORK

In the next few weeks, we will be having the beautiful stained glass windows in our sanctuary repaired and preserved. Over the last dozen years since their installation, the windows have braved the elements, particularly the sunshine that strikes the windows flanking the altar. The overlay on the glass is bubbling and showing significant signs of wear. In addition, paint on some of the side windows has faded badly. So before the damage is irreversible, we knew it was time to act.

Although the company that had done the installation has gone out of business, we were able to find another company (one of very few left) who can do the work, repair the damage and return the windows to their original condition. The bulk of the work will be done in their studio, and the windows can then be repaired in a single day. So the sanctuary will not be open in any way over night.

#### JUST LOVE: GIVING BIRTH TO JUSTICE

How can we use the power God has given us to effect change? What might it look like in our time to follow God's ways of "just love" in support of those who are oppressed? In what ways do people defy oppression with acts of love? What does "just love" require when injustice occurs at the highest levels of government? These are some of the questions that Shiphrah and Puah had to answer for themselves in the story of the Egyptians and Israelites in Exodus, chapter 1. Since Shiphrah and Puah were midwives, Pharaoh orders them to kill all newborn boy babies. Imagine yourself in the shoes of Shiphrah and Puah. The midwives feared God, so what did they do?

Learn what bold risks of love Shiphrah and Puah take when you "zoom in" for the August Tuesday 18th at 4:00 GATHER Bible study. See how they confronted injustice to bring light and life to an oppressed people. Contemplate what it means to be citizens of the kingdom of heaven and of our own country. ## PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Dear Fellow Members of Bethlehem,

August, at Bethlehem, usually brings a congregational meeting at which we review and approve the budget prepared by the council. In this most unusual year, we are finding that many things must be done differently. So too with our budget for the next fiscal year.

Over the last few months, the council has been working on a budget for the fiscal year that begins in September. Ruth Irwin, the Treasurer, has been leading that effort, and I want to thank her for exceptional work during difficult circumstances. As you might imagine, there is quite a lot of uncertainty looking forward to the next few months and beyond. The school is open, and we are so happy that we can offer childcare to essential workers and others who need us and fulfill this mission to our community. But the details of how many students will attend, what ages they will be, whether the state will issue new mandates or lift others is all a bit of a guess at this point.

Adding to the difficulties of the moment, there is the logistical problem of holding a congregational meeting like we usually do. The council has considered this and has come to the conclusion that it is not safe right now to meet in person. And we do not believe that a virtual meeting is possible either. For one thing, our constitution does not permit it. But also, we are concerned that a virtual meeting may not allow equal participation by all. Some of our members do not have internet access and may not be comfortable with technology.

So we have decided to forgo a congregational meeting at this time. Ruth has prepared a best guess budget and the council has approved it. We will be sending a copy to every member both by email and hard copy. We encourage you to read it thoroughly. And to bring any questions or comments you may have to me, to Ruth, to Pastor Megan or to any member of council. Our contact information is in the directory, or you can call the church office to get it. My number is 818-261-0629.

We recognize that facts will change over the next few months and hopefully more will become clear. That may enable us to hold a meeting in person, or it may not. It may require us to revisit our working budget. Whatever happens, the council will address it with wisdom and with the best interests of Bethlehem at heart. And we will keep you informed.

I hope you all are well and coping as well as possible with the profound changes in all our lives. Please remember that your Bethlehem family is always here for you.
