Advent Greetings!

Most years I'm a stickler for not starting Advent or Christmas preparation until after Thanksgiving. Most years I feel annoyed by store displays of Christmas decorations up in October or Christmas

music playing in November. Typically I wouldn't even consider putting up my Christmas tree before the Saturday after Thanksgiving and at church I usually favor a slow process of decorations leading up to Christmas Eve as we make our way through the season of Advent.

However, this is not a typical year! So this year, if you find joy, solace, and comfort in your Christmas tree, holiday decorations, and Christmas movies and you've already had this stuff out since October, I definitely understand! After all, it has been quite a year of things outside of the typical (I even bought a trampoline for my kids this week- something that I never in my life would have imagined I would do-it's that kind of year!).

This season, I think we're all looking for tidings of comfort and joy. During Advent, in these 4 weeks before Christmas, we are reminded of a birth long ago that wasn't typical- a tiny baby boy born in unusual circumstances in a dangerous world. ## **NOVEMBER COUNCIL HIGHLIGHTS**

#### **ACTIONS & ASSIGNMENTS:**

1. Voted to authorize purchasing the cabinetry and sink for the back hall project if the school is willing to pay for it out of School Maintenance funds.

#### **MANAGEMENT**

- 1. In preparation for returning to worship in the sanctuary, Greg Imlay will look into the cost of sanitization equipment and air conditioning filters
- 2. Research is being done on how to include all members in the Annual Meeting if meeting in person is not possible in January.
- 3. The back hall renovation project is over budget; about \$10,228 remains to be paid.
- 4. School expenses are \$3,428 over budget.
- 5. October offerings are on target.

#### **MINISTRY**

- 1. Pastoral Acts:
  - a. A new member class is being held in December; call Pr. Megan for details.
  - b. There is a baptism scheduled for Dec. 6.
- 2. Worship:
  - a. Sundays in-person, outdoors at 9 a.m., and online at 10 a.m.
  - b. Advent music and Bible study led by Pr. Megan on Wednesdays at 6:30 p.m. for 4 weeks beginning Dec. 2. Materials available in the church office.
  - c. Christmas Eve Services, 12/24/20:
    - —5 p.m. to 6 p. m.—Drive-through for a blessing and distribution of care packages containing real candles, candy canes cookies, cocoa mix. Volunteers needed to assist.
    - —7 p.m.—Live-stream, family-style service featuring two skits by Chriselle Almeida.
    - —8 p.m. to 8:30 p.m.—In-person in courtyard, if not raining, with lessons, carols, candle lighting.
    - —9 p.m.—Live-stream candlelight traditional service while singing at home with candles.
- 3. Adult Education: Wednesday night's Zoom book review, Love Without Limits, has 14 participants.
- 4. Fellowship:
  - a. "Spiritual Breathing" led by Pam Shea via Zoom, Sundays, 7 p.m. to 7:20 p.m.
  - b. Connie Troe is looking into having the women's Christmas party virtually.
- 5. Service:
  - a. Bev Compton is looking for a volunteer to serve as liaison to our two Boy Scout troops, if Bethlehem is to continue as sponsor.
  - b. Keira Nussbaum is engaging the congregation in her research on the environmental impact of video screens in the sanctuary to cut down on use of paper for bulletins.
  - c. Mary Fisher organized a drive-through food collection for L.S.S. on 11/08/20.
- 6. School: Emily reported the Trunk or Treat event was a very successful school fundraiser.
- 7. Youth:
  - a. Virtual Sunday School meets via Zoom every other Sunday at 11:30 a.m. with 14 children.
  - b. Youth meet 2nd and 4th Sundays, at noon, in-person in the church courtyard (weather permitting) with COVID safety precautions in place.
  - b. Nicole reported the mask project raised \$682 for the 2022 Youth Gathering in MN.
- 8. Women of the ELCA: The first virtual holiday boutique has raised about \$700 to-date for charities.



The music staff will provide musical pieces for the Wednesday evening study group this Advent season. Each of us signed up to provide a piece correlating to the themes of

Advent: Hope, Peace, Joy, and Love.

Christmas Eve has a variety of events scheduled that will allow people to participate according to their level of risk tolerance. I'm sure a more detailed description of each event exists elsewhere in the newsletter so I will mention them very briefly: 5 p.m. - Drive Up Blessing and Communion, 7 p.m. - live stream of the Family Service which will include the yearly skit and a song parody, 8 p.m. - a brief In-Person Candlelight Service in the courtyard, 9 p.m. - live stream of an expanded Candlelight Service which can be viewed anytime after it is released.


