People of Bethlehem,

I adore poetry. Personally, I love the way that poems can make a profound emotional statement in just a few lines, of the way that they can lead you to realize or to question the world around you

and your place in it. Poetry can be comforting and calming. It can also be disquieting and motivating. When I was in college, I took a summer intensive poetry class at the recommendation of my English Department advisor. At the time, I really wasn't keen on writing poetry, but my advisor told me that I would love the professor and the class would change my life. I went into the class with more than a little fear, but I have to say that my advisor was right. While some of my poetry classmates from college have gone on to publish books of poetry and other writing, for me, learning to write poetry also helped me to understand and respect other people's poems that I read. My experience in that class and the classes that followed blessed me with the opportunity to see poetry as a way to write about and a way to read about God's presence in our messy world. Poetry can convey experiences and emotions in a way that is deeply powerful.

This Lenten season, you will have the opportunity to really explore the poetry of one of my absolute favorite poets. I discovered Wendell Berry while studying poetry in college. His poems explore God's creation and faith and they were an inspiration to me and several of my fellow poet-classmates. I haven't spent much time with his work over the past several years, so it's a joy to spend time with his book "This Day: Collected & New Sabbath Poems". I'll be leading an online discussion of selected poems from that book along with the devotional guide "Wendell Berry & the Sabbath Poetry of Lent". So go ahead and get the book of poems at the library, a bookstore, or borrow it from me! We'll explore poetry, scripture, and sabbath rest during this season of Lent- and you'll be able to do it all from the comfort of your own home by your computer or wherever you can get on your phone to follow along and participate! Details will be worked out, so watch the church Facebook page and keep an eye on the weekly emails & announcements for more information.

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SUMMARY OF BETHLEHEM COUNCIL MINUTES – JANUARY 18, 2020

COUNCIL RETREAT MINUTES

Present at the meeting were Pastor Megan, Sarah Karzel, Janet Puchlik, Brian Grefsrud, Bev Compton, Connie Troe, Lisa Nakata, Mary Fisher, Marilyn Fursman, Leslie Petit, Emily Carlson, Greg Imlay, and Donna Ophus. Shannon Howie, spiritual consultant, was present for the first portion of the meeting.

The January council meeting was a council retreat held at Sarah's beach home. Janet opened the meeting with devotions and prayer.

Shannon Howie was introduced and led us in an exercise into "What Drives You To Serve?". The exercise began with each of us responding to what led us to BLC and why we stay. We then spent time on some introspection into what direction we felt our personal lives were being led. Sarah then led a discussion of the direction that BLC is, and should be moving. We next discussed "impediments to your service" as well as impediments to service by BLC. Points brought up during discussion included fear of asking for help, feelings of being inadequate in having a responsibility all by yourself, serious lack of time, church space problem (open homes for meetings?), communication of needs to be met, and money.

Next on the agenda were plans/priorities for 2020. The problem of space was discussed as well as possible solutions -

- Get together a space planning committee
- Look into finding neighborhood places where meetings could be held such as Starbucks, Coco's, members homes, etc.
- Need for both meeting space as well as "stuff" space

There is a need for strategic planning as opposed to being content and complacent with things as they are. For instance universal preschool could happen, and if it happens, how would that affect our preschool. There are programs available for strategic planning. Bev and Leslie volunteered to look into finding such a program.

After a lunch break plans/priorities continued with committee planning suggestions.

<u>Preschool</u> Bev and Emily brought up the need to continue to explore ways to bring preschool families into our church worship services. As brought up earlier, the possibility of universal preschool also needs to be explored.

<u>Social Ministry</u> Mary brought up our outreach to individuals in the congregation who are celebrating special occasions, who are ill, etc., with cards and calls, etc. "God's Work - Our Hands" is a focus for this year as an outreach to our community with events that introduce BLC to our neighbors. Richard Newcomb can bring a presentation to our church regarding Hope Gardens in Sylmar and their need for volunteer help.

<u>Worship and Music</u> Greg has plans to meet with Sue Akin, our pastors, and music leaders to get their input. He has a goal of doing a survey of our members for their input also. The worship committee is still investigating the use of video screens for the sanctuary.

<u>Mission Endowment Fund Team (MEFT)</u> Janet brought up reminding the congregation to contact an MEFT member if they would like to request funds for a project or cause.

<u>Youth and Education</u> Lisa reported that there is a concern to reevaluate whether the needs of our youth are being met. This would include helping the kids reach out to the community. Planning for the 2021 Youth Gathering in Minneapolis that our kids will be attending is ongoing.

Evangelism Leslie stated priorities for evangelism -

- Tell our story and what we stand for
- Be welcoming
- Work with other committees to coordinate evangelism into all events

Adult Education Marilyn brought up ongoing adult education and other possibilities for more opportunities -

- Wednesday adult Bible study
- Need to plan for men's activities
- Interviews of individuals for the newsletter

<u>Treasurer</u> There is a need to define the role of the treasurer and what is expected. Dealing with individual issues could be dealt with by developing a finance team.

<u>Fellowship</u> Connie brought up needing some ideas for "fun" activities to be planned in the coming year. Some suggestions were - game night, Bunco, Bingo, Glendale Center Theater, picnic, Dodger game, and the Science Center. She is also trying to come up with ways to involve more people in Sunday morning refreshments.

Bev has received several proposals for playground improvements. The preschool board approved the estimate from Innovative Sports Surface Co. The money for this will come from the BLESS fund. The estimate was approved by the council and will be presented at the annual meeting on January 26 for approval from the congregation.

BLC has an upright piano that needs to be donated or sold. This was approved by the council.

The council approved those people presented for membership.

If those reading this have any further ideas than those presented here, please speak with a council member.

Pastor Megan closed the meeting with prayer.

ELCA Good Gifts, Lutheran Social Services, SFV Rescue Mission, Hope in the Valley Rescue Mission – the help center, Epilepsy Foundation LA – Summer Camp, and Hope Gardens Sylmar – housing and training program.

During the year we also made and gave our no-sew blankets to the Thousand Oaks Fire and Borderline Grill shooting victims and friends at California Lutheran University (as requested by Rev. Melissa Maxwell-Doherty) and presented a blanket to each place we sang Christmas carols.

NEWS FROM OUR SPONSORED MISSIONARIES

Greetings from Tanzania! Happy New Year!

We had some wonderful days over the holidays with our niece, who has lived and served with Peace Corps in Mozambique for the last few years. Reflecting on our conversations with her has led us to some deep thinking about an issue that is clear to everyone here but is often difficult to discuss elsewhere: **being white in Africa.**

We live and serve at a university with over 75 staff and faculty and nearly 4000 students. There are six white folk in that group. We are 2 of them.

Everyone knows who we are—students in law, education, and social sciences, whom we have never met and will never teach—they, along with their professors, know who we are. We stand out—not just because of Cynthia's white hair nor Mark's great height. No, the color of our skin makes us remarkable and memorable in ways that are different, requiring adjustment on our parts.

We look like early missionaries—and colonists—who arrived in East Africa in the 19th century. We come from and represent a partner denomination—one of a group of 13 partners, all of whom are majority white denominations and organizations, which provide a lot of the university's financial support. We witness lots of examples of donor-driven activity here—programs that exist because someone—generally a white person—in a foreign city far away decided that the program was needed, or the building should be built, or a staff or faculty member should serve here.

We teach at a university that has one of the best academic libraries in East Africa, a library that holds the largest group of research about the church in East Africa in the world (RESEARCHER FRIENDS TAKE NOTE), and a book and database collection that would look paltry and insufficient for any institution of like size in the US. Our students come to us from an educational system that is underfunded and schools that are overcrowded. These realities have a great impact on what, and how, we can teach.

Over the last three years, we have had a number of students leave campus for a time because of the death of one of their children. Others have left because their wife or husband died. On two occasions, one of our students has died. The terminal illnesses varied in these cases, having only one thing in common: they were all treatable.

We serve in a deeply patriarchal society, the impacts of which splash over into the church. Some parts of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Tanzania partner with the ELCA. Others partner with the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod. Our students, and many in the ELCT, perceive that the money of the partners comes with strings attached—either pressure TO ordain women or NOT TO ordain women. Leaders strive to keep all relations with the partners copacetic, while (sometimes openly) resenting the power that these white-led partners in ministry have over ministry here.

News From Lutheran Social Services

In case you missed our news from last month, we just want to say a huge "Thank You" again for all of the new toys you donated during the month of November and December, and used clothing and shoes, housewares, blankets and food that you continue to donate week in and week out. Thank you so much – we are very blessed.

We also purchased our van in December to help us with our food pickups, thanks to the grant from St. Stephen's/Bethlehem. It is the most wonderful asset for us – we used it a lot during the month of December, but it is used every day for our pickups. Thank you, thank you!!

This last month was a month of partnerships – real and tangible partnerships, some new and some ongoing. First, we have a new partnership with Campus Mission Coalition – LA, a new Lutheran organization trying to help homeless and food insecure students at Cal State Northridge and Pierce College. Just this month, LSS was able to give many, many bags and boxes of food to this organization for distribution to students at those two colleges through their respective food pantries. We hope to continue this partnership for other colleges through Campus Mission.

We also partnered with Best Friends, an animal rescue organization to give them animal food and blankets and accessories that we sometimes have on hand, but do not necessarily need. We received a wonderful letter from them thanking us for the continuing donations.

We continue our partnership with NoHo Alliance at St. Matthew's Lutheran Church in North Hollywood. In addition to men's clothing, shoes and jackets, we are now able to donate lots and lots of bananas to them each week to help their feedings of the homeless. We receive hundreds of bananas from our daily Target Store pickups, so it is nice to be able to share.

We also this month received a donation from the L A Regional FoodBank of a new double door freezer, shelving, food carts, plastic bags, janitorial supplies and cleaning supplies. Thank you to the FoodBank for their many, many years of service to the community.

Lots of things happening, and all good! Blessings to each of you for your continued support. We would normally announce the date of the LSS Annual Breakfast this time of year, however, we are planning the Breakfast for the Fall.

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TWIN VALLEYS LUTHERAN PARISH UPDATE ...

In Bethlehem's December newsletter, we published an article about the development of the Twin Valleys Lutheran Parish (TVLP), a concept that is being developed by some of our Lutheran churches in the San Fernando Valley to form a covenant of clergy and laity to strengthen collaboration in witness to the love, mercy and justice of our Triune God and cast a vision to inform future investment of time, treasure and talents in our regional ministries. TVLP has now filed their Articles of Incorporation and By-Laws with the State of California, and a Board of Directors has been named and will begin their terms immediately. There is still a lot to do, but one of the items on the agenda is a development of a Covenant Agreement with those churches that are interested (in the San Fernando Valley) in joining TVLP. That document should be forthcoming in the month of February. At that time, our Church Council will have the ability to see exactly what TVLP will require of the congregations who would like to join, and also to vote on whether Bethlehem wants to participate at some level. In the meantime, there are several events coming up that Bethlehem may participate in, including some Lenten and Easter functions which you will hear about as the weeks progress.
