Hello Fellow Members of Bethlehem,

This is an exciting time as we begin to plan for the reopening of on site worship at Bethlehem. For many of you, being at the church is so important to the worship experience. And it just doesn't feel right any other way. But for many others, the online experience has been wonderful and fulfilling. And still others may prefer the in person experience but feel more comfortable and safe participating instead in virtual worship. So I want you to know that even after Bethlehem begins on site worship, we will keep live streaming as well. And it is important that you know that you should make your own choice about what feels right to you. Jesus is with you when you worship at Bethlehem; He is also with you when you worship at home.

To say that making the decision about when to reopen is difficult is a huge understatement. It involves the weighing of such enormously important competing interests. As I said above, for many, the in person worship experience is critical; but there is no shortage of examples of outbreaks of Covid that have come from churches. A single case at Bethlehem would be heart breaking for us all and create a cascade of necessary quarantines and potential infections for everyone there. And while you and I can decide for ourselves if we are comfortable with the risk inherent in on site worship, our pastor, our music staff and a number of ushers and others will have to be there to make worship happen. So we will be meticulous in following all of the conditions outlined in the Governor's order permitting opening. And we will be cautious in watching what happens around us as others open.

Last week, the Bishop sent out a letter to the congregations of the synod regarding the process of reopening. In it, he urges caution and reflects on the ways in which worship will be different going forward. It is well worth reading if you have not already. It can be found on the Bethlehem Facebook page and in last Thursday's email.

We believe at this point that we will be ready to reopen by the end of June. We will keep you up to date as we move through June. The Reopening Task Force headed up by Marilyn Fursman will be working on implementing the required modifications to on site worship, and they will share with us what we can expect when we return.

SUMMARY OF BETHLEHEM COUNCIL MINUTES – MAY 2020

ACTIONS

- 1. Received the minutes of the Executive committee meetings:
- a. April 16—regarding scheduling and reduction of expenses in light of the closure of church & school
- b. May 5—recommendation of a bonus for Pr. Fryling for outstanding performance during difficult times.
- 2. Voted to approve minutes of three Council meetings:
- a. April 19—authorized application for free loan through Payroll Protection Plan (PPP).
- b. April 29—authorized resolution to open an account with ELCA Credit union to hold the loan.
- c. May 8—authorized bonus for Pr. Fryling for outstanding performance during difficult times.
- 3. Agreed to notify the congregation that Bethlehem will not be open for Pentecost and to explain how Bethlehem is preparing to re-open.
- 4. Heard recommendations of the Audit committee regarding school discounts.
- 5. Agreed to begin acknowledging special gifts with thank you letters.
- 6. Council members to prepare budget requests for the 2020-21 fiscal year.

MANAGEMENT

1. Bethlehem's application for the Paycheck Protection Program (PPP) was approved through the ELCA Credit

Union; covers two months of payroll and utilities.

2. The preschool re-opened May 4 with 10 students (down from 100), grew to 16, and 45 are expected by June.

In light of reduced needs, some staff was let go and others were furloughed. Discounts are being reviewed.

3. The Task Force on Reopening the Church will comply with local government guidelines and will focus

the safety and health of members as recommended by synod and churchwide authorities.

- 4. The music staff is recording services during the week and a small crew is on hand for Sunday livestreaming.
- 5. March offerings took a dive; April offerings were better. Fiscal Year-to-Date (August 2019 to August 2020)

income is far below budget. Online donations through the church's web site are up (there is a charge to process each donation), and those received during a service on Facebook take two months to get to the church. Diminishing funds in the two-year merger transition account are supplementing income.

- 6. Special donations gratefully acknowledged:
- a. for preschool teachers' masks made by Connie Troe
- b. in memory of Pete Pedersen.

MINISTRY

- 1. Mission Endowment Fund Team (MEFT) distributions totaled \$1,867 for fiscal 2019-20. Grants:
- a. \$380 to cover the transportation for Shea Tuttle, author of "Exactly As You Are."
- b. \$300 to NOHO Home Alliance St. Matthew's Lutheran Church Homeless Outreach Program.
- c. \$300 to Central Lutheran Church Homeless Outreach Program.
- d. \$625 to Down Syndrome Association of Los Angeles.
- e. Remainder for VBS 2020.
- 2. Worship and Music—Sunday Service is pre-recorded or live-streamed online each week, but better lighting is needed. They are struggling with how to keep the choir together when they can't meet.
- 3. Youth and Education— Youth Director Jennifer Adkison is holding two Zoom meetings per week. Members invited to celebrate graduating seniors with a caravan to their houses on May 30, 2 p.m.
- Pr. Fryling is conducting online Sunday School classes (in addition to weekly chapel for the preschool).
- May 24—Confirmation is postponed for seven youngsters who completed the program.
- May 9—A 4-week Zoom Bible study on Jonah began Sat., 7 p.m. for youth and adults.
- 4. Social Ministry—Mary Fisher is coordinating volunteers and clothing needed for the NoHo Home Alliance.
- May 14—There was a Zoom presentation by the Revs. Cynthia and Mark Rich, missionaries to Tanzania.
- 5. Fellowship— No Covid-19 cases to date among members.
- A team of 17 faithful callers are maintaining contact with members through weekly phone calls.

Theologian Dr. Cornel West once said, "Justice is what love looks like in public." So what does love have to do with justice? In Scripture we are reminded about God's vision for a world in which we welcome strangers, feed the hungry, and keep people from suffering from poverty, war, and violence. In the Bible, Micah tells us "to do justice, and to love kindness, and to walk humbly with your God." (6:8). So how do love and justice shape each other?

We look to Jesus who shows us examples of "just love". We see that just love is relational and begins with family and close friends. READY FOR YOUR CLOSE-UP? TIPS FOR YOUR ZOOM VIDEO CHAT

As more and more meetings are taking place via new technologies, such as Zoom video conferencing, here are some tips collected from various online sources to help us look our best and make it a better experience for all participants. Remember, "video" refers to the broadcasting of moving visual images, so take advantage of the fact that it's not audio only (like a phone call) or a flat photograph. So put on a nice shirt and engage!

1. Use the best device.

- Not smartphones, but laptops or tablets with stands, are best.
- They are easy to move to ideal filming locations and will stand up on their own.

2. Get the right angle.

- Use a laptop stand, stack of books, or yoga blocks to align your device with the top of your head.
- Note the round dot above the screen that indicates the camera "eye" and point the camera down slightly or at eye level. No one wants to look up a person's nose.
- Your eyes should not be looking downward towards the camera. It's an unflattering neck view.
- Sit straight. Whatever is aimed closest to the camera will appear enlarged; i.e., elbows, hands, etc.

3. Check your background.

- Avoid backlit glare from windows and harsh lights, which will cast you as a shadowy silhouette.
- To avoid ghoulish lighting, try facing a window or putting a lamp behind your laptop to illuminate your face.
- A plain background works best; so, no plants, trees, or wall hangings growing out of the top of your head.
- Also, avoid walking around with your device. It can be disorienting to the viewer.

4. Improve your sound.

Use earbuds with a built-in mic to help your voice carry more clearly. It minimizes background noises.

5. Plan your call.

- Before a group call, designate someone to lead and consider using hand-raising to control the conversation.
- Avoid the urge to jump in; it muddles the sound.
- To reduce noise, participants should put themselves on mute when they're not speaking.

6. Arrive early.

- It helps to arrive a few minutes early so you can check your audio and video image and be prepared.
- Everyone will be grateful for starting on time.




