People of Bethlehem,

This year during Lent, we're taking a look at Sabbath and our personal and collective need for it

Not sure if you need sabbath time in your life?
Our poetry devotional lists some signs that you need more sabbath in your life. See if any of these apply to you:

1: You don't have time for it. 2: You want to strengthen your relationships. 3: You need more joy in your week (and in your life)! 4: You want to participate in God's sevenfold Spirit of Jubilee. 5: You feel fragmented, frenzied, or stressed. 6: You can't recall the last time you and your loved ones really "rested". 7: And hey, it's in the Ten Commandments (right up there with 'Thou shalt not murder"!).

I'm guessing that at least one of those applies to you! That means that you would benefit from some intentional sabbath time this season. Make it a regular practice once a week during Lent to set aside either a day or a portion of a day to sabbath rest. Even if you

BONUS: Refrain from arguing, gossiping, and problem-solving

just choose one hour each week, it will make a difference! You can make this a family practice and set aside your sabbath time all together or you can make a personal practice where you keep sabbath yourself in some way. It's a good idea to make it the same day or same time frame every week so that it can become a reqular habit. Who knows—you may find it so spiritually and personally helpful that you continue the practice even after Lent is over! At the very least, try out this practice for this season and I'm sure that you will notice a positive difference in your life.

- —Voted to approve a proposal for landscape improvement (pending submission of a detailed plan) by Dylan Yribe for his Eagle Scout project.
- —Voted to add two new members, Sandra Burkhardt and Lynn Dalgleish.
- —Heard decision of Worship & Music team to hold 2020 Christmas Eve services at 5 p.m. and 9 p.m.
- —Heard and discussed the proposal of Twin Valleys Conference to establish a non-profit "parish" to be supported financially and physically by member congregations (fees to be determined).

MINISTRY:

- —Pr. Ittu called the first meeting of the new Visitation team on Feb. 13; assignments were made.
- —Celebrated the baptism of Bryn and Shelby Andersen on Feb. 16 with cake and a basket of books.

Jan. preschool income is \$2,942 over budget.


Fiscal Year-to-Date preschool expenses (incl. food and teachers' salaries): \$35,220 over budget.

CONGRATUATIONS TO NANCY HALL: THE DOWN SYNDROME ASSOCIATION OF LOS ANGELES VISION AWARD HONOREE



Nancy Hall was born and raised in Reading, Pennsylvania where she received all her education. For the next 18 years, she worked in various hospitals and laboratories in Wilmington, DE, Pasadena, CA and finally Woodland Hills, CA. Since childhood, she has always been involved in church activities, in preparation for her work with DSALA.

She married Clarence Hall in 1957 and his job in the chemical field and finally the pharmaceutical field, moved them cross country three times, finally landing in Northridge, CA in 1974.

In May of 1976, she and Clarence were blessed with a beautiful daughter, Andrea, diagnosed with Down syndrome at birth. Valley Presbyterian Hospital directed them to the Down's Syndrome Parents Group

(eventually became DSALA) and they began attending their monthly meetings at Children's Hospital where they experienced the support of other parents. The group had been organized the previous year and incorporated just before Andrea was born. So, a wonderful mother became their peer counselor, taking Nancy to the Early Intervention Program that Andrea joined immediately giving her an excellent early developmental start. Lifelong friendships were begun for both Andrea and her parents.

A sister, Anita, born in 1978, proved to be a further training opportunity and a life-long friendship for both girls. When Anita was 3, Nancy agreed to join the board of the parents' group, eventually becoming its President. At that point there were many things the group wanted to begin and felt that the best way would be to have someone specifically working on them. Nancy was appointed, working one day a week- out of her house. Later, a parent, provided a small (dusty, furniture-making space for the group. Thanks to some wonderful fundraisers they were able to rent larger and larger offices and increase the Director's time to five days a week.

During the 15 years that Nancy served as Director, she organized the office, developed a library, which she took to the monthly meetings in the L.A. area. With the assistance of many wonderful friends, there were ongoing peer counselor training sessions and several very successful family conferences titled "The Six Stages of Down Syndrome" which provided information to all age groups. She also presented to medical groups, high school and college classes. She held a workshop on DSALA's peer counseling service at an annual meeting of the National Down Syndrome Congress and facilitated several programs in L.A. for the National Down Syndrome Society, including the annual Buddy Walk. Walk. Some of her most successful fundraisers included celebrities from the Star Trek television series.

Retiring in 2001, after 25 years with the organization, Nancy shifted her energy to her church. At St. Stephen's Lutheran Church, she served as Council president, education chair, assisting minister and Grace Notes bell ringer. She also produced the monthly newsletter, kept up the church calendar and coordinated rental of the facility. She also enjoys zumba, games, her hiking group and her book club.

Nancy recently accepted a leadership role again in DSALA and was very happy to receive a grant from the proceeds of the sale of the St. Stephen's property. It is being used to renew the peer counselor training program. She is grateful that Bethlehem Lutheran Church has shown an interest in supporting DSALA and provided space for the annual Christmas dinner and dance for its 50 members.

News From Lutheran Social Services

We get lots of phone calls at LSS every day asking for services. We are noticing a trend in the last several months of women, mostly seniors, living in their cars and looking for affordable housing. Some have lost their homes due to unfortunately circumstances (the long-term care of a loved one, loss of a job) some have lots their apartments because of a sharp increase in rent or the sale of their buildings to developers who move everyone out, and some have been homeless for quite a while. With Safe Parking LA, some of these women at least have a safe place to go to at night. F or the last several months, there has been no affordable housing with any of our city or state agencies, and no funds available for even a few nights at a hotel. For families, it is the same scenario but for some city agencies, if you are part of a family, you have a much better chance of finding some affordable housing. It's a very complicated and vexing (read annoying, frustrating and worrisome) situation. Imagine being over 65 or 70 with no home except your car.

Thoughts for our religious community here in the San Fernando Valley?

Due to the grant we received late last year from Bethlehem/St. Stephen's, we were once again able to help a single mom with a baby with her utility bill. Her utilities had already been shut off, but we were able to get them back on and also pay a portion of her bill. She came in last week and did not know we were also a food pantry and clothing closet, so she was able to get lots of food and almost brand new baby clothes, blankets, diapers and wipes for her son (who was just so cute with an unbelievable head of hair!) We were also able to help a single man in a wheelchair with his gas bill this month, thanks again to this grant.

We've had a fun month hosting 30 6th through 8th graders and 25 9th through 12th graders at LSS for their annual service hours. They were all from a Christian school and they have worked at LSS the last 3 years. They put together hygiene kits, organize our food pantry, hang clothes, wash housewares, paint, flyer the neighborhood and many other tasks during the two days they were there. We really appreciate them and their energy! Blessings and thanks for all you do for LSS.
