People of Bethlehem,

It's been a tough six months, hasn't it? It's been challenging figuring out what has become our new way of living- both as a church and as individual people. We've slowly started opening

things up at the church for small groups to meet and for outdoor worship, all while being very careful about following the required guidelines for safety. We've been continuing our online optionsworship, Bible study, youth group, book club, meetings, and social time, because we know that it's still not safe for us to all be together at once the way we were before and we know that you all have a range of comfort levels with navigating online platforms and the risks of being together in person.

When the Church Council met last month, we talked a lot about the different ways that we want to try to keep everyone connected. So you'll be hearing about more donation collection days, you have already gotten the invitation to our brief Zoom Fellowship time on Sunday mornings, we're looking into more options, and the council members are always glad to hear your suggestions too!

One of the things that we have coming up is a Drive-Thru Blessing. On Sunday, October 11 from 12-1 p.m., we'll have stations set up in the parking lot so that you can drive your car in and get communion, devotional materials, and a special little stress-reliever ball gift from Bethlehem (Because who isn't in need of a way to relieve stress these days??). We're looking for volunteers to help with set up, distribution, and clean-up that day, so let me know if you're interested. The drive-thru is welcome to everyone- church members, community members, friends, and family! You'll have to stay in your car, but you'll get to see all of the volunteers helping out that day as you drive. It's the opportunity for a blessing, but also a chance to get to see some of the Bethlehem friends you haven't seen in a long time.

1. The Council brainstormed about new ways to keep members connected during this shutdown.

#### **MANAGEMENT:**


- 1. We are in a position to begin the forgiveness process of the Payroll Protection Plan loan.
- 2. There were no questions from the congregation about the Proposed Budget for 2021.
- 3. August offerings were under budget by nearly \$2,000.
- 4. Bids are being sought for plumbing and roof repairs.
- 5. Mary is looking for furniture for the back hall project.

#### MINISTRY:

- The Youth Chalk Art fundraiser was well-received.
- 2. The Sunday School Bible fundraiser also was successful.
- 3. In-person worship began again Sundays at 9 a.m. with a faithful group of six to ten persons.
- 4. The Sunday on-line service continues at 10 a.m. [is viewed by 200-400 persons each week] and all agree it should continue to be offered after the quarantine is over.
- 5. Communion is always available to be picked up in the church office.
- The Wednesday evening Bible study is serving the needs of about a dozen people at 6:30 p.m.
- 7. Mary Fisher is scheduling monthly drop-offs for community service projects.
- 8. Pr. Megan will conduct a "blessing of the animals."
- 9. There were 20 children at the first virtual Sunday School class. Materials were picked up earlier.
- 10. The women's annual holiday boutique is going virtual.

## GENESIS PROVIDES GLIMPSES OF GOD'S INTENTIONS AND MORE...

#### Co-ed adult Bible study resumes in person

The book of Genesis traces our origins from cosmic beginnings through stories preserved from pre-history. Each story provides us with a glimpse of God's intentions, how God acts, and who we are in relationship to God and the rest of creation. In this study, participants will explore early stories of faith and God's promise in the book of Genesis through each session's big question.

This course explores selected passages from Genesis.

- 1. Origins: Where do we come from? (Genesis 1:1-2:25)
- 2. Mystery and Boundary: Can we live with God's terms? (Genesis 3:1-24)
- 3. Troubled in Paradise: How does God deal with evil? (Genesis 6:11-14; 7:1-5; 7:17-8:4; 9:8-17)
- 4. Hanging on a Promise: How long, O Lord? (Genesis 11:31-12:4; 17:1-8; 18:1-15)
- 5. How could God ask such a thing? (Genesis 21:1-8; 22:1-19; 25:19-26)
- 6. Does God love just anyone? (Genesis 27:1-10,15-17,22-35; 32:22-32)
- 7. The Future: Yours, Mine, or Ours? (Genesis 37:1-11,23-36; 41:14-16,25-36)
- 8. Are We Promise Bearers? (Genesis 42:1-8; 45:1-10,25-28; 46:28-30; 49:29-33; 50:15-26)

Ready to dive in? Pr. Megan Fryling facilitates this course in Chandler Hall beginning Wed., Oct. 7 at 10 a.m. Current restrictions allow only a small number of people to attend in person, so please let her know at pastor@bethlehemlutheran.net or text 610-680-7220 if you will be present (masked and maintaining proper distancing); workbooks are provided.

## WOMEN OF THE ELCA BIBLE STUDY

#### **Women's October Bible Study Focus: Holy Time**

The women's three-session fall Bible study series, "Holy Time," explores scriptures to see how God is present with us in the past, present and future, and the role of time in the daily living out of faith.

Who should attend? All women of the church are automatically members of Women of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America and welcome to participate in local, regional and churchwide events (currently on hold due to the Covid-19 pandemic); however, under President Dianne Tillman's leadership, Bethlehem Women of the ELCA continue to engage in fellowship and monthly Bible studies via Zoom online conference meetings on the third Tuesdays at 4 p.m.

Last month, they explored what it means to remember the past faithfully.

This month (session two) the focus is on God's presence in the present—the holy now. Reflecting on the present is harder than it sounds. "Now" is always changing from one moment to the next. We are so close to it that it can be hard to see the big picture. In a fast-paced world, it's often easier to focus on "what's next" or "what used to be" than to be fully present.

Marilyn Fursman is leading the October discussion, which focuses on these questions:

- —How do we grasp the times we are living in?
- —How did Jesus, the woman who anointed him, and Paul all recognize "kairos" time-and what is it?
- —What does it mean to recognize our calling to "be present"?

The Bible study is found in the award-winning Gather magazine; extra copies are available in the church office. The next Zoom meeting is on Tuesday, October 20 at 4 p.m. Check the weekly church emails for the link and join the discussion!
