As we strive to return to what we consider normal, in 2021, I hope we can try and keep this poem in mind. As we address the changes, challenges and the dreams for realizing our church's potential, as it says in the poem, I want a Church that looks forward as well as backward and includes all.

UPDATE ON INDOOR WORSHIP

As we near the one-year mark from the day that we began our pandemic restrictions and closures, we all recognize that this has been a difficult year. We all look forward to the return to something that feels more normal in our lives, and especially when it comes to worship. During the pandemic, we have followed the guidelines, rules, and recommendations that have been given by the Los Angeles County Health Department. We have been blessed with members who have been willing to volunteer to make online worship work through sending in videos to contribute and we've been blessed with volunteers who have made in-person outdoor worship work by setting up, welcoming everyone, and cleaning up afterward. Now, we look forward to a move to modified indoor worship.

The current plan is that we hope to have indoor worship in the sanctuary again once Pastor Megan has been fully vaccinated. The hope was that, as part of the Bethlehem childcare center staff, she might be vaccinated in February, however, the timeline for vaccines has moved slowly, so it's currently looking like she has the possibility of trying to find an appointment for a first vaccine sometime in the beginning of March. Once she's had her first shot, we will have a much better sense of an actual timeline for the return to the sanctuary. In the meantime, Gerry Puchlik has worked to find a way to pull in fresh air and circulate the air in the sanctuary with large fans in the doorway. We've been working on a setup for how we will distance the pews and we'll be continuing to follow precautions for the health and safety of everyone-masks, physical distancing, no singing indoors, and no childcare or fellowship. As people get vaccinated and as covid-19 numbers decrease, we'll gradually get back to the in-person indoors worship and fellowship that we had before. We continue to pray for the health and well-being of all in our community and all throughout the U.S. and the world who have been impacted both by this deadly virus, but also by the strain and difficulty this has caused for all of us. We pray that God grants us comfort, peace, and hope as we move forward.

- 3. Learned Bethlehem was approved for a second PPP loan for the full amount of \$218,827;
- 4. Sarah Karzel is preparing the application for forgiveness of the first PPP loan of \$197,000.

5. Heard the status of plans to reopen the church for in-person, indoor worship and there will not be any schedule changes just yet.

6. Asked all Council members to make a short video stating hopes and dreams for the coming year.

7. Received with gratitude a gift of funds for three projection screens for the sanctuary, in memory of member Esther Natenstedt.


Please join us on Saturday, April 3 for Bethlehem's Easter Egg Scavenger Hunt !!!!

SANCTUARY HVAC SYSTEM FIRE

On the afternoon of February 14, the fire alarm went off in the church building while Vicente and Pastor Megan were the only ones left in the building. The fire department arrived and we couldn't find a source of the fire after searching, so they eventually left after checking everything out. Gerry and Janet Puchlik arrived to help with the situation and that's when we realized that the sanctuary HVAC system was what set off the fire alarm. Pastor Megan had fortunately turned off the sanctuary heat when the fire alarm went off (which can only be explained by the inspiration of the Holy Spirit!), so we had avoided further damage.

While up on the roof, Gerry and Pastor Megan called 911 and asked the wonderful firefighters from Station 118 down the street to come back because the sanctuary HVAC unit felt extremely hot. When the firefighters arrived, they came and opened the unit up. The motor bearing had frozen and the insulation inside the duct had caught on fire and was badly burned. The HVAC unit was damaged, but fortunately the fire didn't spread further. We're in the process of getting prices for replacing the HVAC unit, which is in need of replacement now.

We will also be collecting cards for Adopt-A-Hospital project. Poster boards are also at church for people to sign.



NEWS FROM OUR SPONSORED MISSIONARIES

We write, deep into the first semester of the 2020-2021 academic year. Our classes are humming along and other projects are progressing as well. We write here of two: an **Intensive Student Reading Group on Race and Christian Theology**, and an experiment in **training for congregations in Mission Engagement**.

RACE AND CHRISTIAN THEOLOGY

In mid-2020 when we were still in the U.S. and watching the news of protests and movement in race relations, we started discussing how



university students were engaging—and sometimes initiating—national and international conversations about race. This led to dialogue with Cynthia's brother R. Ward Holder, who teaches at Saint Anselm College in New Hampshire, and to two grant applications to develop a joint student learning initiative on Race and Christian Theology, bringing students from Saint Anselm's and Makumira together in learning about key African and African American thought about race and theology—a combining of topics not made by many of those leading protests and movements demanding an increase in racial justice.

News From Lutheran Social Services

A huge, enormous thank you to everyone who contributed to the Food Drive in February when you went to pick up your Lenten bags. We were running out of canned goods, and we received dozens and dozens of canned goods, really helping our Food Pantry to not look so bare! So thank you, thank you.

We've had some questions lately about what we take and don't take at LSS, especially in light of the pandemic. So here goes: we take any and all food items, including canned goods, frozen food and fresh or perishable foods. Just fyi, if you have expired canned goods that you want to donate, all food banks have extended code dates that we go by, so if a can is just expiring, or expired 3 or 4 months ago, we can still take it because of these extended code dates published by our Regional FoodBank. Anything older than World War II however, we can't use. We are also taking used clothing for men, women and children's clothing, shoes and blankets, and new toiletries, paper towels, toilet paper and cleaning items. What we have enough of for several months at least are household items, children's toys or items related to babies (car seats, rockers, bathing seats, etc.), and children and adult books. We do not take furniture, car parts, electronic equipment or pictures (wall hanging type).

Hope that helps everyone for now. It changes every so often, so if you do have something you're not sure of to donate, just give me a call.

Story for the month entitled: Can You Ever Not Care? This last week, we were blessed to receive some unused lunches from LA Unified, fully packed with a sandwich, chips, fruit, drink and cookies or crackers – really great. The day we received the lunches, we were actually closed and the food bank was not open. A woman came in looking very frazzled asking if we had any food for children. I asked her what she needed, and she said that because the schools were all closed, her 3 kids were not eating regularly, especially for lunches, and that she had missed several days of trying to pick up some from a school that was giving them out for free. She said she would just take 2 lunches and they could share. So of course we gave her 12 lunches, she broke down crying, then we both sat on our bench crying about how awful it is to not be able to feed your children. Something probably very few of us have ever had to experience. After 20 years of doing this, I still can't ever not care, and it looks like the members of Bethlehem can't either. Bless each and every one of you.
